Writing

We will be using texts and short animations to model good writing and take inspiration for own writing and drama. This term will focus on these areas:

 Setting descriptions, writing a postCard,

to share every day.

 Diary entries, short stories, persuasive letters and some seasonal poetry. Maths

Place Value

Numbers to 100. Writing in words, expanded form, counting in tens, partitioning. Using number lines to count and estimate. Ordering numbers and objects. Count in 25, 55, 105 and 35.

Addition and Subtraction

Bonds to 10, fact families, + and - 1s, add three 1 digit numbers. + and - across 10, two 2 digit numbers. Missing number problems.

Shape

Recognise, sort, name and draw 2D and 3D shapes. Count sides, edges, vertices, faces and lines of symmetry. Make patterns with shapes.

Gymnastics

P.E

Floor and apparatus: jumping, rolling, balancing, travelling individually and in combination. Using shapes, levels, and directions. Learn to work safely with and around others and whilst using apparatus. Give and receive feedback.

Dance

Explore space and how the move to express and idea, mood, Character or feeling, dynamics and expression. Use counts of 8 consistently to keep in time with the music and a partner. Pupils will also explore pathways, levels, shapes, directions, speeds and timing. They will be given the opportunity to work independently and with others to perform and provide feedback beginning to use key terminology.

RE

Old Testament: Stories and prayers.

We will look into the stories and the characters of the Old Testament; Noah, Abraham, Jonah, David and Daniel. This will introduce the children to important images of God found in the scriptures.

Sharing in the life of Jesus: Mary, the Disciples, Saints and us.

We will learn about the life of Mary and Jesus and the call of the disciples. Also, about some saints who have responded to the call of Jesus. Children will experience the prayer of silence as an opportunity to spend time with God.

Advent - waiting for Jesus to Come, we will look at the symbols and Characters of the liturgical Season of Advent as a season of preparation.

Spellings will go home every week followed by a test. We will focus on the sounds g can make, word endings and challenge words.

Handwriting

Correct pencil grip and joined writing is our focus in each lesson.
