
<u>Attendance</u>




Hope









Year Four Class News


沉 Our Year 4 Dentist Visit 沉

She also explained how plaque can damage our teeth, the importance of brushing our teeth, the jobs of our teeth and which teeth are the most dangerous and what will happen to our teeth if we don't keep up with regular 2-minute brushing.
