Reading

Children will continue with their own independent reading using our reading scheme and taking reading

books home to read with an adult. In class we will spend lessons on comprehension and reading for enjoyment, Visiting the library and a whole class reading book to share every day.

Writing

We will be using texts and short animations to model good writing and take and drama. This term will focus on these areas:

- Newspaper Reports
- Recounts,

Maths

- Fractions Recognise and find a whole, half, quarter and third
- Time minutes in an hour, hours in a day. Tell the time: o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to, to 5 minutes. Analogue and digital clocks
- Statistics read and create, tally charts, tables, pictograms
- Position and direction language of position, movement and turns.


RE

Easter - understanding the stories of Easter from the New Testament and of the symbols the Church uses to celebrate the Season. Build on previous learning about the story of finding the empty tomb and the symbol of the Easter Candle.

Pentecost - understanding the story of Pentecost and the activity and presence of the Holy Spirit. The way Pentecost is celebrated in the Church and Confirmation the Sacrament of the Holy Spirit.

Our Church - understanding what it means to belong to God's Family. The role of the parish and people with special responsibilities. Children will also hear about the origins of the Church through the lives of the Apostles. Builds on previous learning in Year 1 about the story of St. Peter and St. Paul and about special roles and responsibilities in the Church.

The Mass The structure of the Mass and what is taking place. Christ present when we gather, in the Word and in the Eucharist



Magnificent Monarchs

The English and British monarchy from AD 871 to the present day. Using timelines, information about royal palaces, portraits and other historical sources, they build up an understanding of the monarchs and then research six of the most significant sovereigns.



This project teaches children about the growth of plants from seeds and bulbs. They observe the growth of plants firsthand, recording changes over time and identifying what plants need to grow and stay healthy.

Animal survival

Exploring the life cycles of some familiar animals. They build on learning about the survival of humans by identifying the basic needs of animals for survival, including food, water, air and shelter
